### St Ignatius Loyola 1491 – 1556 (Feast Day 31 July)

St Ignatius Loyola was born to a noble Spanish family. His early adult life was spent perusing the life of a vain soldier. His life changed dramatically the day his leg was shattered by a cannon ball during the Battle of Pamplona. Laid up in bed recovering, Ignatius spent his time daydreaming about women and heroic adventures. Unsatisfied by the possibility of a permanent limp caused by the way his leg was setting, Ignatius ordered his leg be re-broken to enable it to set straight. In this now lengthy recovery, in desperation to entertain himself, Ignatius read the only books in the Castle, 'A Life of Christ' and 'The Lives of the Saints'.



Soon he began daydreaming about doing saintly heroic things, and noticed to his surprise that these daydreams left him feeling more satisfied and more at peace with himself. Ignatius began to turn his life to God and there on followed a journey of profound spiritual experiences, during which he wrote his now world famous 'Spiritual Exercises'.

Ignatius now knew he wanted to give his life in service to the Church and with his Spiritual Exercises he had a tool to help people to discover God's call in their own lives.

Ignatius humbly returned to take up studies he knew he would need to make an impact on individual lives, the Church and the world. Ignatius led pretty much anyone who would listen through his spiritual exercises, and quickly became popular and surrounded by some very loyal compatriots (among them Francis Xavier, and Pierre Favre). These men became the founding members of 'The Society of Jesus' or 'The Jesuits' as they became to be known. They placed themselves at the disposal of the Pope, to be sent to serve the Church where the need was greatest.

Ignatius was a man of great humility; a mystic with an incredible ability to discern the will of God for him, the strength to work incredibly hard and take difficult decisions, the leadership and imagination to inspire countless followers, and the skill to manage what came to be one of the most formidably religious orders of all time.

## The Sixth Commandment and Safeguarding

You may well have seen or be watching this 'true-crime' tale of a predator poisoning two vulnerable victims, it is an intense and harrowing story. Especially so as it is the dramatisation of murder at the hands of a deputy churchwarden in the diocese of Oxford. Following a lengthy trial, the murderer, Ben Field, was sentenced in 2019.

Such is the impact of the series that the Diocese has pledged to update the "facts and corrections" section of the Diocesan website following each new episode, in order to clarify the truth behind details changed for the show.

So far, Oxford Diocese has clarified that (1) the killer was never considered for ordination training, and was not a 'trainee vicar'. They have also clarified his role (2), the show claims he was a "churchwarden", but instead, Field was a "deputy warden", a role with no formal office in the Church of England, and with no real definition. The Diocese described the case as a "hugely difficult ordeal for all those affected".

His conviction also prompted a review into "lessons learned" within the Diocese. The review made 13 recommendations, including seven key themes for improving safeguarding within the church, such as monitoring volunteers.

Recognising the harrowing and intense nature of this series it is, for some, impossible to watch, for others it is compulsive viewing. We also need to remind ourselves that in 'true' dramatisations the theme may be of importance but the facts are not necessarily accurate.

And, of course, this story underlines the importance of good safeguarding practice and the very significant role of PSOs (Parish Safeguarding Officers) who have the responsibility to respond to any disclosure made or concerns raised if somebody believes that a child, young person or vulnerable adult may have suffered, may be suffering or is at risk of harm though abuse, exploitation or neglect. But safeguarding is not their 'job', it is the responsibility of each and every one of us to be aware of the All Saints Safeguarding Policy (available on the opening page of the All Saints Website).

We will either catch the 12.20 or the 12.54 train back.



As you may be aware there has been an intermittent fault on the sound system recently.


An engineer visit has been scheduled for Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> of August and hopefully repairs can be made on the same day.
