▪ Homelessness in Bristol

You will have seen the next event in the '*Let's Talk About*' series is focusing on '*Homelessness*' which will be held tomorrow, Monday 16th October, at 7.00pm.

Here in Bristol the number of people sleeping 'rough' on the streets has increased drastically, by a factor of 9 since 2011. That is nine times more homeless people here in Bristol in six year.

You may also have seen the **Bristol Post** article (6th October 2017) featuring Danny and Glenn from Clifton Village. These two, with quite different stories, now live rough in Clifton and, unlike some, do not engage in 'street based anti-social behaviour' (apart from begging), but are now subject to a court injunction. Their plight, as an example of many similar stories, needs reflection and perhaps a revaluation of what we mean when we talk about 'justice' and 'Justice'.

The Danny and Glenn story is an example of many such stories and demands deeper reflection from us all – from City Council to Bristol Citizens. The account was provided as a lead to the Bristol Post from within our own worshipping community.
