Places<br>without history that have become established villages or towns.<br>Berinsfield (after todays commemorated Saint) was the first English<br>village built on virgin land for 200 years (in 1960). Berinsfield became<br>the 'dumping ground' for those considered difficult by Oxford City<br>Council. Pray also for challenged and challenging families. |

| 8    | Birth of the Blessed Virgin<br>Mary  | Pray for and give thanks for parents; remembering those who<br>desperately want children but are unable to have them, those who<br>have children but are unable to care for them. For foster parents and<br>all who work to ensure children have a parent.  |
