Gaudete Sunday (Advent Three)

Several people have asked why the third candle on the Advent Wreath is pink (or rose). As you know the liturgical colour for Advent (and Lent) is purple symbolising a time of reflection, repentance and fasting. This is because during Advent we reflect on the Second Coming and the end of all things.

You'll have noticed that the readings have been full of the visions and descriptions of the events that will mark the end of all things and initiate the coming of the Kingdom. This is far different to the current commercialised version of Advent that's all about Christmas things.

This Sunday, the name, Gaudete, comes from the first words of the introit (*Gaudete in Domino semper*: 'Rejoice in the Lord always' – think Steeleye Span). The third Sunday has been declared a halfway break from penitential exercises and becomes a 'Sunday of Joy'. This is reflected in the rose coloured vestments and in the pink (rose) candle in the wreath. This tradition became established in about the fourth or fifth century, though the Advent season was reduced in length in the ninth century.

Gaudete Sunday (Rose Sunday) also marks a change in the theme of Advent. We turn more from reflecting on the Second Coming to consider the Nativity of Christ in terms of Word made Flesh, God becoming fully human, the promise of our redemption and our need to see the living God in the face of humanity.

Interum dico, Gaudete! - 'Again I say, rejoice!'


