Mass Setting: NEH 541

Welcome on this most Holy Night as we celebrate Christ's rising from the darkness of death to give eternal light and life to all who look in faith to His saving glory.

Please take a candle and gather outside church around the fire. Words in bold type are to be said or sung by all. Hymns from New English Hymnal.

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT

The Easter fire kindled, the celebrant introduces the Liturgy:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, on this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord. We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever in God.

The fire is blessed.

Let us pray. Eternal God who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light: set us aflame with the + fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The celebrant cuts a cross into the Easter candle. He traces **ALPHA** above the cross, **OMEGA** below and **the numerals of the current year** between the arms of the cross.

He says: Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. **Amen.**

The celebrant inserts five nails or incense grains into the candle, representing **the wounds of Christ**.

He says: By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard and keep us. Amen.

The celebrant now lights the candle from the new fire, saying:

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The deacon raises the Candle and sings,	The light of Christ
All genuflect and reply:	Thanks be to God

Preceded by the thurifer, the Deacon bearing the candle leads the procession into the atrium to the south east door. The choir follows the clergy party, and the people follow the choir. The procession pauses, the candle is raised, all genuflect.The Deacon sings:The light of Christ.Thanks be to God.

All candles are lit. The procession leads into church and up the centre aisle to
the Sanctuary step. The candle is raised, all genuflect.The Deacon sings:The light of Christ.Thanks be to God.

The people enter their pews and remain standing.

The Easter candle is set on its stand. Candle and book are censed and the Deacon sings the **EASTER PROCLAMATION** - **THE EXSULTET**, joyfully announcing the beginning of Eastertide.

THE READINGS

After the Easter Proclamation, the people sit down for the readings, the candles remain lit. The celebrant introduces the vigil:

As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his Son to be our Redeemer; and let us pray that through this Easter celebration, God may bring to perfection in each of us the saving work he has begun,

FIRST READINGThe CreationGenesis 1.1-5,26-endSilence follows for reflection

Responsorial Psalm 104 **R:** Send forth your spirit O Lord and renew the face of the earth

After a pause this collect is sung

Let us pray. Almighty God, you have created the heavens and the earth and made us in your own image: teach us to discern your hand in all your works and your likeness in all your children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit reigns supreme over all things, now and for ever.

Amen.

SECOND READINGThe ExodusSilence follows for reflectionResponsorial Canticle based on Exodus 14R: I will sing to the Lord glorious his triumph!

Exodus 14.10 – 15.1a

After a pause this collect is sung

Let us pray. Lord God our redeemer; who heard the cry of your people and sent your servant Moses to lead them out of slavery: free us from the tyranny of sin and death and, by the leading of your Spirit, bring us to our promised land: through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THIRD READINGCall to Heed God's WordIsaiah 55.1-11Silence follows for reflectionIsaiah 55.1-11

Responsorial Canticle based on *Isaiah 12* **R:** *I will praise you Lord; you have rescued me.*

After a pause this collect is sung

Let us pray. Most merciful God, who by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ delivered and saved the world: grant that by faith in him who suffered on the cross we may triumph in the power of his victory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. **Amen.**

Bells now ring as an organ fanfare introduces the **Gloria in excelsis** and the lights go on

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

COLLECT OF THE MASS

Let us pray. Lord of all life and power, who through the mighty resurrection of your Son overcame the old order of sin and death to make all things new in him: grant that we, being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in glory; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour, glory and might, now and in all eternity. **Amen.**

EPISTLE READING

Romans 6.3-14

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

The first Alleluias of Eastertide are sung, each repeated after the priest

Luke 24 1-12

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. SHORT ADDRESS The Venerable Michael Johnson, Archdeacon of Bristol

THE BAPTISMAL LITURGY

The Easter celebrations are intimately connected with baptism, which first unites us with the risen Christ. In joyful celebration the Litany of the Saints is sung as the people's candles are relit and the Easter candle (preceded by the thurifer) leads the procession to the font. During the Procession the People light their candles from the candles on the front and back pews;

The celebrant introduces the Renewal of Baptismal Vows

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead we remember that through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life within the family of his Church. Now that we have completed our observance of Lent, we renew the promises made at our baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ, and our rejection of all that is evil.

Therefore, I ask these questions:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? I reject them. Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? I renounce them. Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour? I repent of them. Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I turn to Christ. Do you submit to Christ as Lord? I submit to Christ. Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life? I come to Christ.

The celebrant introduces the Blessing of Baptismal Water, saying

Praise God who made heaven and earth, **who keeps his promise for ever.** Almighty, God whose Son Jesus Christ was baptized in the river Jordan: we thank you for the gift of water to cleanse us and revive us; we thank you that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the Promised Land. We thank you that through the deep waters of death you brought your Son, and raised him to life in triumph. Bless this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and in his resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Send you Holy Spirit upon them, bring them to new birth in the household of faith, and raise them with Christ to full and eternal life. For all might, majesty, authority and power are yours, now and for ever.

The celebrant now introduces the Profession of Faith

Let us now proclaim the Christian faith into which we were baptized and in which we live and grow.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, who made the world? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son, Jesus Christ, who redeemed mankind? I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Almighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all those who have been baptized in your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Amen.

The celebrant signs himself with the blessed water, a symbol of spiritual renewal, and then sprinkles those nearby. The following psalm of triumph is sung, the celebrant continuing to sprinkle the people as the clergy party return to the sanctuary

<u>THE PEACE</u> The celebrant says

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said, Peace be with you. Then were they glad when they saw the Lord. Alleluia.

and also with you. Alleluia!

Let us offer one another a sign of peace. *All may exchange a sign of peace, greeting one another with* Christ is risen. **He is risen indeed.**
