Inclusive Church: Social Action, Mental Health and Disability:



This week the second Inclusive Church workshop took place where we considered Mental Health and Disability. The group recognised that 'Inclusive Church' was much more than keeping the doors open, though keeping the doors open is hugely important. It is also more than having no discrimination as to who it is that comes through our church doors and in making all feel as welcome as we can.

An 'Inclusive Church' is also an active church! What is it that we do here at All Saints which demonstrates our inclusivity when we consider Mental Health and Disability?

- Recognised as a Dementia Friendly Church
- 'Friends on Friday' a monthly 'café event' open to any and all without discrimination
- Afternoon Worship a short monthly act of worship open to anyone who wishes to find a short, familiar, safe and small (few in number) act of worship
- Intention to offer a regular weekly Mass (probably Saturday) for a few to gather, without expectations and no human contact
- Providing a place of safety for those who walk in off the street
- Plans for changes on floor level to provide ease of access and accessible toilet
- Providing a postal address and additional support for those with health issues
- Charitable giving during our planned seasonal giving
- Uplifting those who are in need in our prayers
- Action in the 'Fifties Forum' and for those alone and lonely in our community

These are a few of the activities in which we engage that enable us to be described as an 'Inclusive Church'.

Gaudete Sunday

This is the Third Sunday in the Advent Season. A season where we focus on the three-fold coming of Jesus; his first, his present and his final. The liturgical colour for today is rose (instead of the purple or deep blue of Advent).

This day also marks a shift in two distinct ways. First, it allows a break in the penitential focus of Advent as part of the season of preparation for the feast of Christmas (the first Advent).

The name come from the Latin Word for 'Rejoice' (Gaudete) being the first word of the opening antiphon from today's Mass:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Let your forbearance be known to all, for the Lord is near at hand; have no anxiety about anything, but in all things, by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be known to God. Lord, you have blessed your land; you have turned away the captivity of Jacob."
