Parish Officers and Responsibilities

This year the Annual Parish and Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) will take place on Sunday 19th April. Its purpose is to:

- Elect Churchwardens
- Election of a number of additional roles (such as Deanery Synod Representatives and LLM Representation)
- Presentation of the Parish Report
- Presentation of accounts (included within the Parish Report)
- Appointment of the auditors
- Confirm annual revision of Electoral roll

At the moment we are two months away from the APCM so why mention it today? This year there will be a number of opportunities for election or re-election. The Churchwardens, three Deanery Representatives and four Members of PCC. As is the tradition, one of the Churchwardens will be re-elected to remain in office.

This is the reason I am bringing this to our attention now, so that everyone has time to think about who they might encourage to stand for these posts.

Real Opportunities

These are real opportunities. All Saints is an active and busy church with a great deal going on; both in worship and prayer, and also in the engagement with the community. The two main comments from visitors are the sense of prayerfulness when they come into church and the evidence they see of a living, active church engaged in its mission. This is great and really powerful; it is a feeling that I think we want to encourage in ways that respect our catholic heritage yet address the needs of people today.

So too with Deanery Synod. The turgid and rather repetitive nature of Synod is going and increasingly the focus is on enabling real things to happen; things that matter. The next Synod, for example, (on Wednesday 12th February at 7.30pm) will focus on the Climate Emergency. We will have the Diocesan Environmental Adviser (Clare Fussel) and the Bristol City Councillor (Carla Denyer) with us emphasising the importance of church and state working together to address this global issue at a local level.


Two Actions:
