Church and was established as a monastic practice by Benedict in the 6th century. It is a way of praying the scriptures that leads us deeper into God's word. We slow down. We read a short passage more than once. We chew it over slowly and carefully. We savour it. Scripture begins to speak to us in a new way. It speaks to us personally, and aids that union we have with God through Christ who is himself the Living Word.

Thomas Cramner in his Homily on Scripture ended it with an exhortation to read it in this way:

"Let us ruminate, and, as it were, chew the cud, that we may have the sweet juice, spiritual effect,
marrow, honey, kernel, taste, comfort and consolation of them."

On Wednesdays in the five weeks of lent there will be two Lectio Divina sessions, one at 2.00 pm and the other at 7.00 pm. Both will take place at the Vicarage – unless otherwise planned


