Last Sunday afternoon there was a celebration in Birdcage Walk to mark the 200th anniversary of the consecration of St Andrew's Church. The Church was destroyed in an air raid on 24 November 1940, just a week before the same fate befell the original All Saints. The service was led by Charles and by Paul Langham with the Lord Mayor, Paula O' Rourke, in attendance.





On the night of November 24 1941, the church fell victim to the severe bombing of Bristol by the Luftwaffe. It remained a shell for several years, the ruins being finally demolished in 1956. It had been hoped to save the tower but it was found to be unsafe and soon followed the rest of the church into oblivion. The churchyard survives, together with the path through it called *Birdcage Walk*.

The site of the church is marked by an inscribed stone set in the lawn. The very base of the walls survive in part. The outline of the medieval church was marked out by hedging to the south. Christ Church became the parish church of Clifton, one of eight churches carved out of the former Clifton parish in the nineteenth century.

Donations have been incredibly generous, each and every penny will help the people of Ukraine survive the coming winter and the hardships of war.




Food Point – Plus One Challenge !




