Another Year Starts......

There seem to be so many alternative starts to the year. Each has a different impact on us as we try to work our way through the relevant hazards and opportunities.

At this time of year our thoughts are not driven by Financial, Calendar or Church focus, but by the combination of the Academic Year and the post-holiday autumnal start-ups. This is the time of year when activities seem to come alive and gain traction and we start, once more, to plan for the future.

Looking forwards there are always challenges, though this year they seem a great deal more acute. The combination of rising inflation and cost-of-living, along with catastrophically soaring energy costs will bring havoc to many. Not only individuals and families, but also organisations and businesses.

Here at All Saints we will not be escape the impact. Energy costs for churches are the same as for businesses (and thus not capped) – and we use a great deal of gas! However, as you are aware, we have plans to eliminate our 40% energy loss and also commence the generation of a proportion of our power through solar panels and an air source heat pump. These actions will make a very significant difference in energy use in the medium and long term and also ensure that we meet the demands of achieving our Net Zero targets. Hopefully we will see these plans turn to reality in the not-too-distant future.

Not just Energy

Energy aside, every one of us is experiencing the impact of inflation and the increasing costs of goods – basic or otherwise. One glance at the weekly shopping bill indicates the seriousness of this situation. Pensioners, middle and low earners, those unemployed or unable to work, and the many others who, for one reason or another, are on the edge of society and outside any support networks, will have to make decisions about expenditure that would have been unimaginable a year ago.

It is reasonable to expect a church response to this situation. Part of the response is 'speaking-out' and ensuring that the church has voice and actively addresses issues of injustice and inequality. Part of the response is action, at a local level, with other partners and churches and across the Diocese.



If you take a quick glance at the activities in which we engage at All Saints there is much to rejoice about:

- * Charitable Giving frequently matched by the All Saints Trustees
- **Loaves and Fishes Project** with the Sisters' supported through donation, gifts and time
- **Friends Together** the church, community and partnered approach to supporting those living with dementia and their carers
- * Inclusive Church increasingly fostering a reputation for being welcome and open
- **Community Engagement** (including Clifton Down Community Association, St John's Primary School, Churches Together, Local Business, Health and Social Care providers etc)
- * Provision of 'Place' for significant groups focused on well-being
- **★** Pop-Up Self-Service Food Point
- Many individual contributions of time, money and gifts to a whole raft of support organizations

This short list includes items that occur to me as I write and may overlook others! A huge thank you to all who engage in so many of these activities, in so many different ways. I'm aware that for many the engagement is in holding these activities and the topics in the discipline of prayer life – thank you for this.

As we continue to move forward, supported by the work of the National Church and the Diocese (in the work that will come from 'Transforming Church Together') we will need to ensure our relevance in our own context. In other words, in our partnership with the *missio Dei*, what does this call us to do right here, in this community, now and for the future? Alongside our life of worship and prayer, this will call us to identify and prioritise missional focus that has meaning, purpose and relevance.


This is a subject to which we will be returning over the autumn.

There is financial support available for people and businesses that need to replace vehicles that don't meet the zone's emission standards.


