## GOLD AWARD FOR ALL SAINTS!



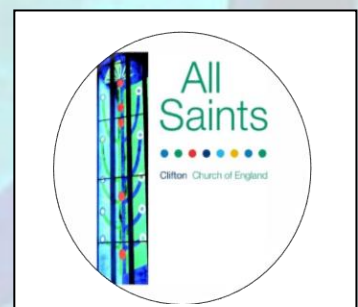

## **LAMBETH PALACE**

### **Prayers for the Sovereign and for the Royal Family, and Prayers and Forms of Service for Accession Day**

1. On 17 September 2022 the King directed by Royal Warrant that the prayers for or referring to the Sovereign or other members of the Royal Family should be altered, and the amended forms used thereafter. The Warrant confirms that in any text pertaining to the Sovereign in any form of service authorized for use in the Church of England, 'King' should replace 'Queen', 'Charles' should replace 'Elizabeth', and instead of 'Sovereign Lady' the words 'Sovereign Lord' should be inserted, with the appropriate changes of pronouns.

2. In the same Warrant it is directed that in every prayer for the Royal Family contained in any form of service authorized for use in the Church of England, instead of the words 'Philip Duke of Edinburgh, Charles Prince of Wales' the words 'Camilla the Queen Consort, William Prince of Wales, the Princess of Wales' should be inserted. The Prayer for the Royal Family in the Book of Common Prayer therefore now reads:

*Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, we humbly beseech thee to bless Camilla the Queen Consort, William Prince of Wales, the Princess of Wales, and all the Royal Family : Endue them with thy holy Spirit ; enrich them with thy heavenly grace ; prosper them with all happiness ; and bring them to thine everlasting kingdom ; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

3. In a further Warrant the King directed that the forms of prayer and service used on Accession Day as previously set out in the Book of Common Prayer and Common Worship for 6 February should now be used on the anniversary of his Accession, the eighth of September. Accession Day is a Commemoration in the Common Worship Calendar, which now falls on this date (shared by the Lesser Festival, the Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary)

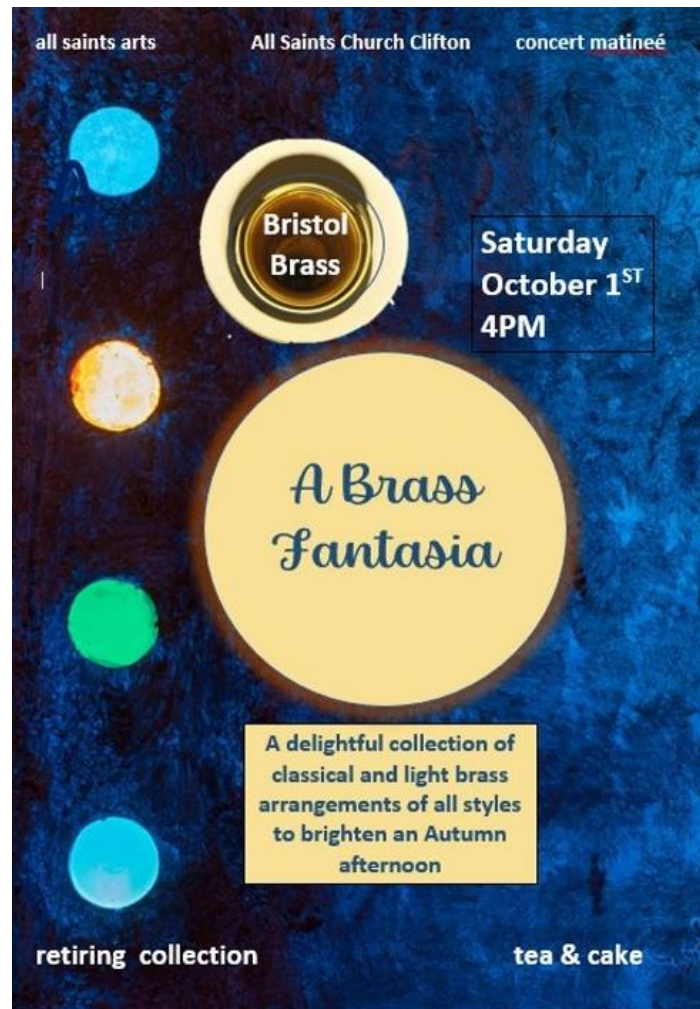

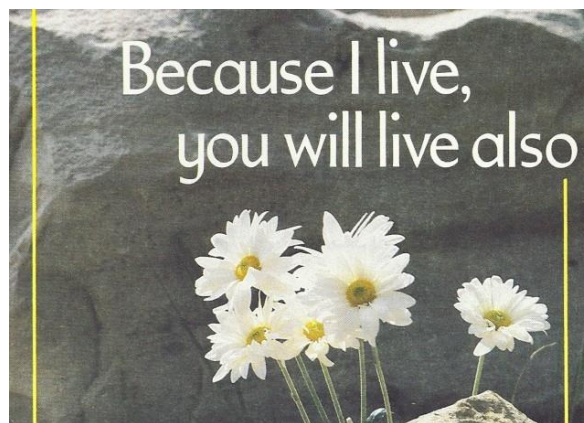

Mon September 2	<b>Bp George Bell, Chichester Peacemaker 1958</b> Friend of Dietrich Bonhoeffer and opponent of area bombing. Pray for civilians caught in wars and conflict, for the unthinking use of violence against civilian populations; remembering where this has happened in the past (Germany, Britain, Japan and Spain) and where it's happening now (in so many parts of the world, Syria and Sudan).
Tue 4	<b>Francis of Assisi 1226</b> Pray for all through whom we receive sustenance and life; for farmers and agricultural workers, for packers, distributors and company boards; for all engaged in research to safeguard crops against disease, and to produce abundant life among those who hunger and whose lives are at risk. Wed 5	<b>Mass 10.00 am</b> Pray for those in medical profession working to halt, cure and care for breast cancer sufferers. Pray for those who suffer from the condition and who fear the condition. Pray for those who survive (more than 80%)
Thurs 6	William Tyndale, Scripture translator reformer 1536 Pray for linguists, those who help people across the world understand each other. Pray for those who translate books for the learning and benefit of all. Pray for those who translate the bible to allow all to have access to its content.
Fri 7	<b>Mass 10.00 am</b> Pray for all who teach; in our schools and universities, colleges and on courses. May we all be active learners, continually listening, challenging, thinking and growing. Pray for St John's School.
Sat 8	Pray for all who work to conserve our marine life and the health of the marine environment. Today is World Octopus Day, they are one of earth's great survivors.
