Missional Giving

The PCC has selected two charities to split the year's missional giving. As has happened quite often in the past, one is a local charity and the other international in its reach. The two charities are:

Refugee Women of Bristol





The only multi-ethnic, multi-faith organisation which specifically targets the needs of refugee women in the city, Refugee Women of Bristol is governed directly by women of the refugee and asylum-seeking communities.

Founded in 2003, the charity provides services to those considered to be over and above the generic category of 'refugee', and routinely reaches groups of women that other service-providers overlook or are unable to access

Refugee Women of Bristol offers support in a number of different ways, including online resources, life skills classes, information workshops and crèche facilities.

Each year the organisation supports roughly 300 refugee and asylum-seeking women and their children, from countries such as Somalia, Sudan, Iraq, Iran, Syria and Gambia.



Christian Aid - Ukraine Over the last six months, we've been working through the ACT Alliance and our local partners to support and bring hope to thousands of Ukrainians. We're working with three partner organisations in the ACT Alliance: Hungarian Interchurch Aid (HIA) in Ukraine and Hungary; the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) in Poland; and Swiss Church Aid (HEKS) in Ukraine, Hungary and Romania, to offer assistance to internally displaced peoples and to refugees.

With unprecedented support so far, we've been able to distribute money to respond to a wide range of needs, including: supplying trauma kits and baby incubators; enabling cash distribution so that Ukrainians can decide their own priorities for themselves; focusing on vulnerable groups such as women, children, people with disabilities; the frail and elderly. So far, HIA have reached 26,187 people with lifesaving aid, shelter, truckloads of food (345 metric tons); water, sanitation and health support, and offering vital information for refugees and internally displaced people.

Today you will notice that this week the Prayer list section is empty of names and subjects. Thought the Intercession Book does have entries that will be used during the coming week.


Please could you listen to the names mentioned in the prayers and then let the Parish Office know if anyone has been left off and which day of the week they should be included.


