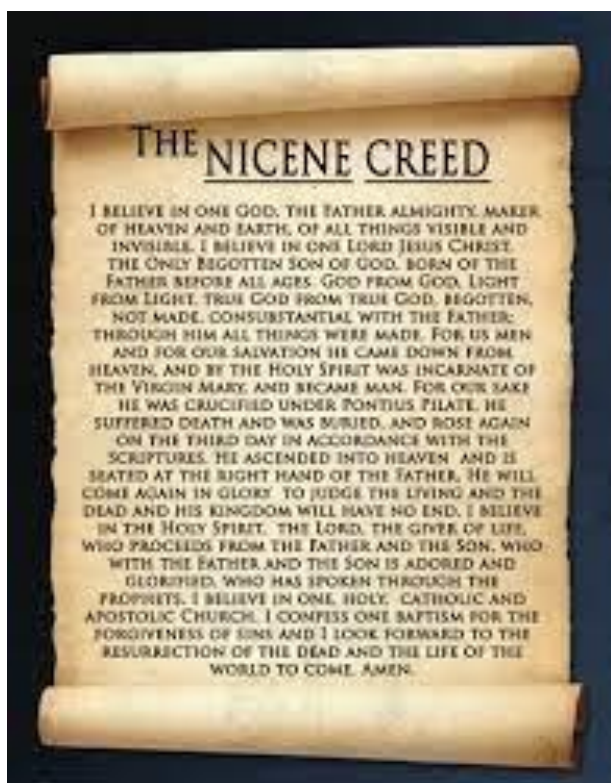

## The Nicene Creed

'A spacious and generous faith'

A series of three sermons starting  
next Sunday.

Our reciting of the Nicene Creed may not feel like the most exciting part of our worship - indeed, a certain amount of 'switching off' may go on! But it has been part of the Church's liturgy for about 1600 years and is there to invite us into and remind us of the full riches of the Christian faith. St Thomas Aquinas, perhaps one of the two or three greatest theologians and philosophers of the Church, amidst all his voluminous writings, wrote that fundamentally Christians were asked to believe two things: that God exists and that we are loved in and through Jesus Christ. The Nicene Creed calls us into that life-giving and saving belief, an invitation into a 'spacious and generous faith.'

These three sermons will attempt to suggest ways of exploring and unpacking what is being given to us in this great document.

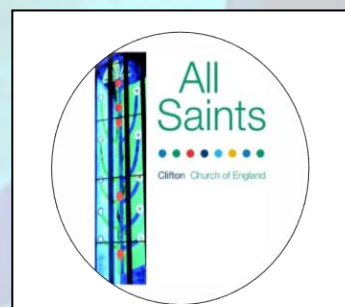

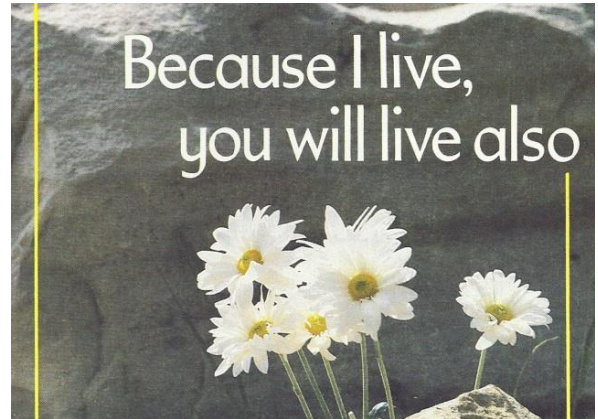

# ALL SAINTS PRAYERS

Mon 24	God of compassion, walk alongside all of your global stewards who work to create a more just and peaceful world. Equip the United Nations community with a sense of urgency and humility that lets your will be done. (United Nations Day)
Tue 25	<b>Crispin and Crispian Martyrs 287</b> Pray for cobblers, curriers, tanners and leather workers. Essentially a craft or fashion topic in the West but a fundamental aspect of society in developing nations.
Wed 26	<b>Mass 10.00 am Alfred the Great, King of the West Saxons, Scholar, 899</b> Pray for the provision of education in the UK. Our schools, teachers, preparation of teachers, school governors, all who make decisions that shape the future of education. Alfred believed that all (boys) should receive an education. Pray for the Governing Body of St John's School.
Thurs 27	Pray for all who serve in the world's navies. Especially our Royal Navy, theirs is a role beyond defence and security, very often acting to bring support and safety, and immediate relief, rescue and aid.
Fri 28	<b>Mass 10.00 am Simon and Jude Apostles</b> Neither Simon nor Jude stand out like their namesakes, but both stuck faithfully to Jesus in his ministry. Pray for all who quietly live their faith.
Sat 29	Animals that live in the home virtually become members of a family. Some have real responsibilities as 'Assistance Dogs', many others, cats and dogs, provide companionship and purpose for those living alone or vulnerable in our society.
