Christ the King

Feast of **Christ the King**, also called Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, festival celebrated in the Anglican, Roman, Lutheran and other Protestant Churches in honour of Jesus Christ as lord over all creation. Essentially it is a magnification of the Ascension, it was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Originally, it was celebrated on the last Sunday in October, but in the revised Common Liturgical Calendar in 1969, it was moved to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time (immediately preceding Advent), where its theme of Christ's dominion made it a fitting end to the liturgical year.

Christ the King is one of the most important titles of Jesus. Even though Jesus Christ was not a king in the earthly sense. He is the divine King of the Universe, who unites all of creation with the Father. As St. Paul tells us,

1 Cor. 15:25-28 For [Christ] must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. For God has put all things in subjection under his feet. When all things are subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to Him who put all things under him, that God may be all in all.

Raising our frailty to glory above.

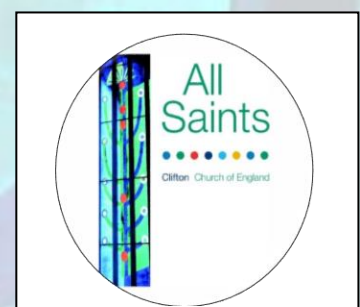

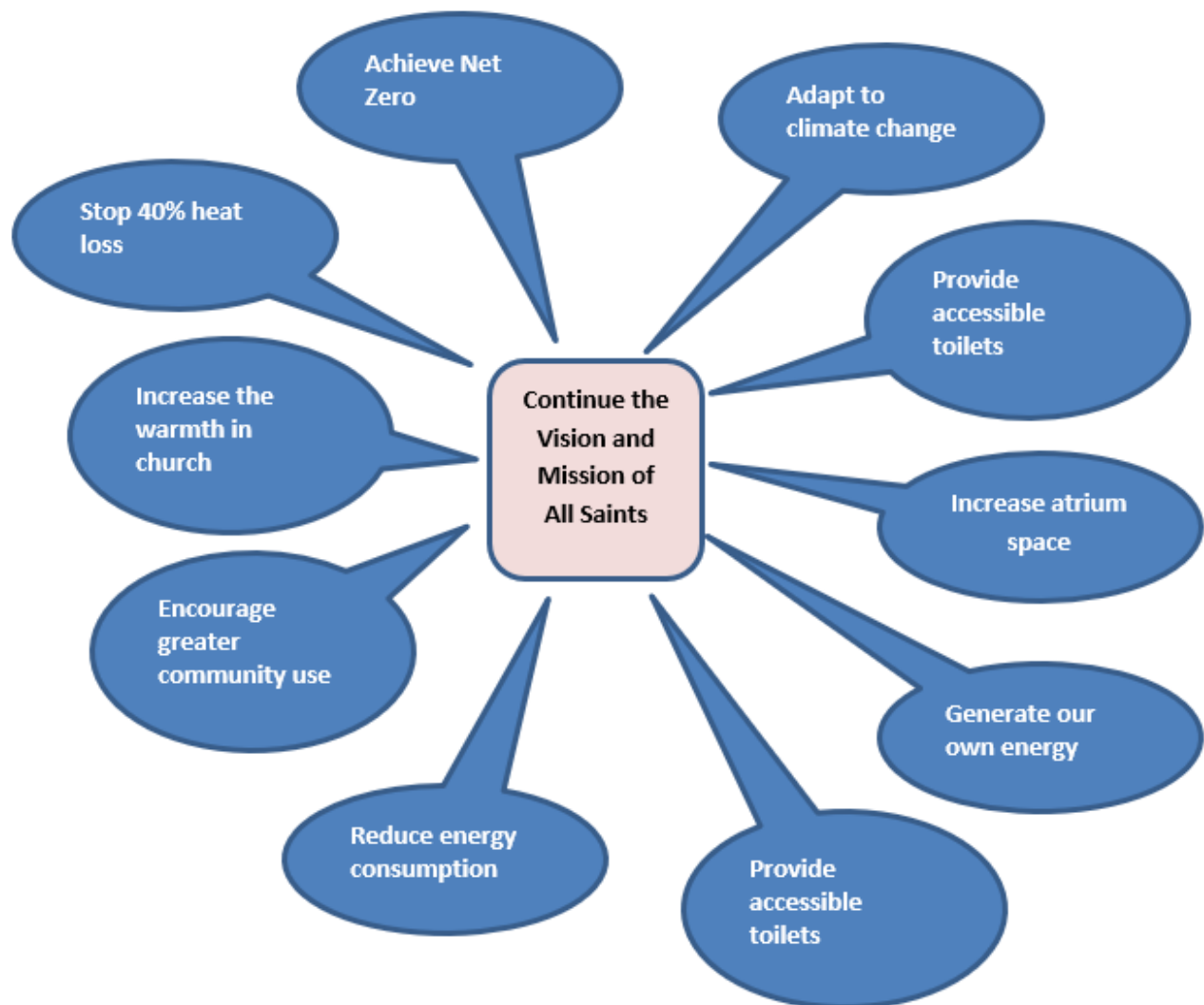
The Atrium Development

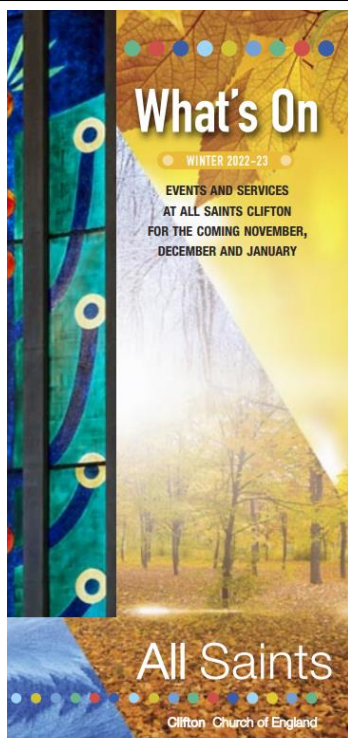


The Beyond Foam - Demonstration and Workshop led by Michael Bowyer was an outstanding success.

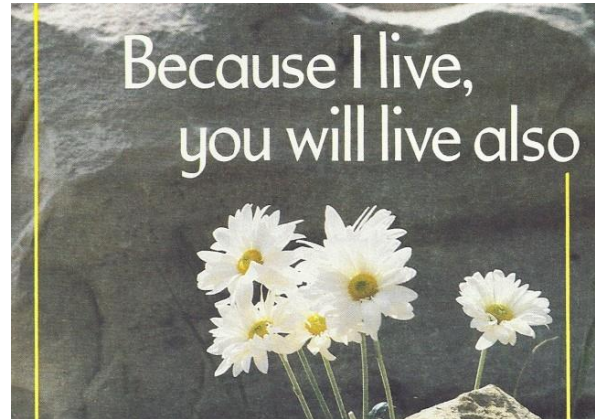
