The Second Half of Advent

The lighting the rose candle on the Advent wreath has taken place – does is indicate anything else?

The Advent season is split between an earlier part, which sort of echoes the last part of the previous liturgical cycle when we focus on the Second Coming of Jesus. We're thinking about the future, we're thinking about that time when Jesus will come, escorted by the angels and saints. We're thinking about that moment in history that will end history, and usher in once and for all the definitive Kingdom – the Kingdom of justice, and mercy, and peace. The Kingdom where the lion will lay down with the lamb. The Kingdom that will be the perfection of all things in Christ.

And our prayers and our focus for the last two weeks has been on that reality, that there will be a Second Coming. There will be a day of judgment. There will be a day when this order as we know it is passing away, and the new heaven and new earth will become real. We long for that day, we yearn for that day, we desire that day, we look forward in hope for that day. And we pray: Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus!

We have been doing that for the first two weeks of Advent. With the third Sunday of Advent, that shifts. We look back in history to the first coming of Jesus. We begin in a very earnest way by looking at the historical reality of the fact that God became incarnate in the person of Jesus of Nazareth.

We will look at the events leading up to His birth, we will look at the events of His birth in the Christmas season and celebrate them as the gradual epiphany of the miracle of God's love for us is made manifest in human history.

And a sign that we have begun that second half of Advent are the prayers used at Evening Prayer that accompany the Magnificat. These are called the O Antiphons. These are the great antiphons that make up the song O Come, O Come, Emmanuel. There are seven of them leading up to December 25 and then into our Christmas season, that each highlight a different aspect of the mystery of the Incarnation.

The "O" Antiphons

The Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the Magnificat canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfilment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well.

Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.



December 17

O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 19

O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 21

O Radiant Dawn, splendour of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 23

O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

December 18

O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 20

O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness

December 22

O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

Bristol North West Foodbank The Christmas Charity

The Bristol North West Foodbank operates within the Deanery of Bristol West and is part of the parish work of St Andrew's. Fr Charles is Area Dean of Bristol West and All Saints is within this Deanery.

Bristol North West Foodbank is an Anglican Charity and affiliated to the Trussell Trust network of over 430 Foodbanks across the UK.



The Foodbank has been open for 11 years and during that time they have helped more than 60 000 people crisis with the provision of emergency food parcels. People suffer a crisis for many reasons, such as benefit changes, debt, redundancy, ill-health, family break up or just unexpected large bills.

All Foodbank clients are referred to by local care agencies who identify individuals and families in crisis. Anyone in crisis from North West Bristol, stretching from Avonmouth to Henbury, Hotwells to Lawrence Weston and areas in between, can have access to this Foodbank. This is pretty much all of the Deanery of Bristol West.

There are also four outlets that provide access to food support in Avonmouth, Henbury, Hotwells and Lawrence Weston.

In 2019 they opened a Social Justice Hub in Avonmouth, with the vision of extending support and providing a more holistic service. The Hub now houses the office and warehouse and our growing services include:

- Homebank
- Free-advice Appointments
- Cookery Courses
- Dancercise Classes
- Support for Homeless
- Woodwork Class

Much of this is designed to help tackle social isolation.

Fuel Costs: the £66 discount and redistribution

New figures released on 18 Nov 2022 show the Energy Bills Support Scheme successfully provided a £66 discount for 97% of eligible households in England, Scotland and Wales in its first month. This is the first payment made through the EBSS since it launched in October and will see households receive a £400 discount on energy bills paid in 6 monthly instalments.

Vouchers were sent to all 2 million customers with traditional pre-payment meters.

At All Saints, a process has been set up for any of us who might like to redistribute some of this money so that it reaches those who really need it.

Sister Teresa, of the Sisters of the Church, already gives £20 a month (specifically for the pre-payment meters) to around 23 people who are on very low incomes. This £20 tends to last about a week.




