
'Thy Kingdom Come'

During the 9 days between Ascension Day and Pentecost the Churches have dedicated the time of prayer (Novena) to Thy Kingdom Come. This is a global prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to faith. What started in 2016 as an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England has grown into an international and ecumenical call to prayer. The intention is that people:

- Deepen their relationship with God in the person of Jesus Christ
- Pray for God's spirit to work in the lives of those they know
- Come to realise that every aspect of their life is the stuff of prayer

After the very first Ascension Day the disciples gathered with Mary, constantly devoting themselves to prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Like them, our reliance on the gift of the Holy Spirit is total – on our own we can do nothing.

Through the centuries Christians have gathered at that time to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit. 'Thy Kingdom Come' picks up this tradition. Over the past three years more and more worshipping communities have dedicated the days between Ascension and Pentecost to pray 'Come Holy Spirit'.



This year, 2024, the author of the Novena is Bishop Anthony Poggo, General Secretary of the Anglican Communion, and he leans on his rich African heritage to shape the prayers of these nine days. This year the focus is on the early chapters of Revelation for the daily studies. The troubled world in which we live has much in common with the setting of the last book in the Bible. Violence, oppression, abuse of women and children were part and parcel of life in the Roman Empire as they are around the globe today.

'Rock and Stone'



Several pictures are exhibited within the Atrium.

They follow the theme of 'Rock and Stone'.

Three depict natural formations created over time due to erosion and the changing eons. Three capture locations in which people have placed stones in particular formations to recognise and respond to powers inexplicable and beyond human understanding.

'Ancient and Modern' attempts to capture these various thoughts in ancient stones, placed or built, at Stanton Drew -the 'Great Circle'.

Ascension to Pentecost – The Great Novena

The word novena means "nine" and is used to describe nine days of private or public devotion or focused and persistent prayer for a specific cause, usually as a form of petition or intercession but also as a prayer of thanksgiving for blessings received, devotion to a particular saint or feast day, as a period of mourning a loss, or anticipating a significant event.

The nine days of a novena come from the time that the Apostles and Mary waited in prayer between the **Ascension of Jesus** and the coming of the **Holy Spirit on Pentecost**.

During this Novena a Prayer Station will be maintained under the Balcony with a prayerful introduction.

St. Mary's Church, Fairford & Kelmscott Manor

Saturday 25th May 2024, 10.30am-5.30pm

From medieval stained glass to iconic artworks and objects of the Arts & Crafts movement, this day excursion into the beautiful Gloucestershire countryside will encompass it all!

The morning consists of a visit to the beautiful market town of Fairford, Gloucestershire, including a guided tour of St. Mary's Church, notable for its complete set of 28 medieval stained-glass windows. In the afternoon a short drive away is the beautiful 16th Century Grade I listed Kelmscott Manor, which was the country home of William Morris, Father of the Arts & Crafts Movement. It's recently been fully refurbished and is full of iconic of artworks and objects, all owned and designed by Morris himself. As well as a visit to the house, you'll have time to stroll through the beautiful gardens, and visit the shop and café.

This day trip is not to be missed, and includes travel by luxury minibus (pick-up and dropoff from All Saints Church), a guided tour of St. Mary's Fairford and entrance to Kelmscott Manor and Gardens.


