Ordinations this Petertide

Ordinations traditionally take place at Petertide, which falls around the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29. This is for a number of reasons, historical, theological, and practical:

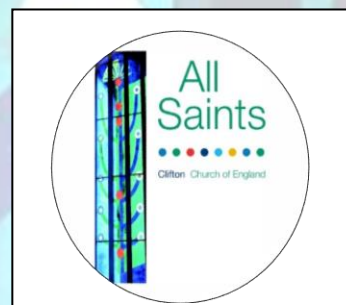
- 1. Historical Tradition:** The timing of ordinations around Petertide has deep historical roots in the Christian church. It became customary to ordain new clergy at this time, honouring the legacy of Saint Peter, one of the key apostles and considered the first Pope by the Roman Catholic tradition. This timing reinforces the connection to the apostolic succession and the continuity of church leadership.
- 2. Theological Significance:** Saints Peter and Paul are significant figures in Christianity, representing the spread of the gospel and the foundational work of the early Church. By scheduling ordinations around Petertide, the Church underscores the new clergy's role in continuing this mission. The Feast of Saints Peter and Paul celebrates their martyrdom and contributions, making it a fitting time to welcome new leaders who will carry on their spiritual work.
- 3. Liturgical Calendar:** Petertide aligns well with the Church's liturgical calendar, often occurring after Pentecost, when the Church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit and the beginning of the Church's mission in the world. This period is seen as an appropriate time for new beginnings and the empowerment of new clergy through the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Practical Considerations:** The timing of Petertide, at the end of June, coincides with the end of the academic year in many parts of the world. This allows seminarians to complete their studies and be ordained before they begin their assignments in parishes. It also provides a natural transition period for the newly ordained to move into their new roles during the quieter summer months before the busy fall season.

This Sunday (30 June) there will be eight candidates made Deacon in Bristol Diocese. On Saturday 29 June and Monday 1 July, twelve Deacons will be Ordained Priest.

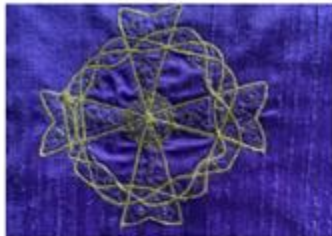
Additionally, Sister Teresa will celebrate with us for her **First Parish Mass here at All Saints**. This will take place on Sunday 14 July at 10.30am.

The General Election will be a moment for the nation to ask important questions about the future. Pray Your Part is an invitation from the bishops of the Church of England to encourage prayer and participation in the life of our nation and communities, both as voters and as citizens.

This 21-day journey of prayer and reflection (from Friday, 14 June until Election Day on 4 July) is designed for use in the run-up to the UK General Election. Each day explores a different theme, with a short Bible reading, reflection and prayer for a different aspect of our common life.

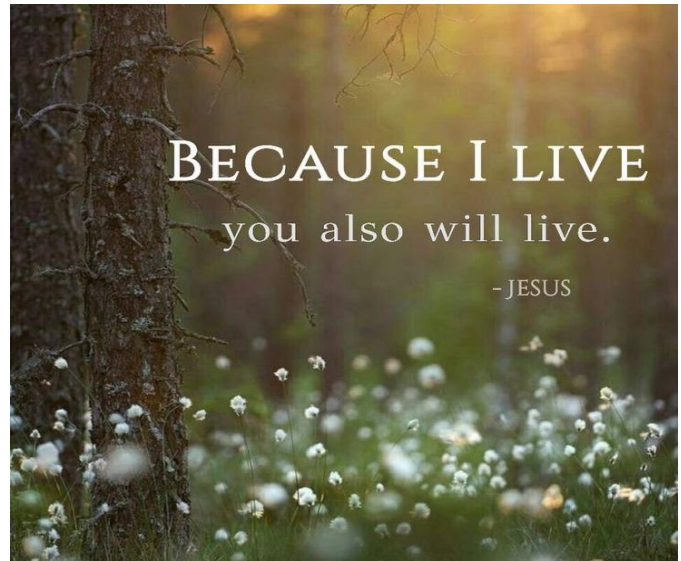
