The Ghent Altarpiece. Adoration of the Mystic Lamb, 1432
Jan van Eyck



This is the Central Panel of the Ghent Altarpiece, situated in St Bavo's Cathedral in Ghent.

When we look at the Altarpiece, our full attention is drawn to this large centre panel, in which a divine liturgy is performed around the Lamb of God, Jesus Christ, in a green landscape with a high horizon. An altar stands in the middle on a small green mound, possibly representing Mount Zion. The Lamb stands erect on the altar - alive but bleeding from a wound. It's blood spurts out into a chalice. The allusion is clear - Christ's death and resurrection - his sacrifice for humanity - are commemorated on the altar during every Mass. The scene as a whole refers to the Last supper when Jesus described the wine as his blood, which he was to shed for all humanity to earn the forgiveness of its sins.

Many believe that the groupings of the figures appear to follow the traditional liturgy for All Saints' Day – which would explain the adoption of this image as the All Saints' Banner.



# **Annual Act of Remembrance at St John's War Memorial**



Every year on Armistice Day, 11th November (unless it falls at a weekend) an annual service of remembrance, started by Fr Richard Hoyal in 2006, is held at St John's War Memorial at the junction of Apsley and Whiteladies Roads, Clifton. All Saints Church continues to be lead organiser on behalf of *Churches Together in Clifton, Cotham and Redland*, as the memorial is in its parish.

The first service was attended by a handful of parishioners and passers-by but, over the years has grown considerably. Not only do many more parishioners and passers-by join in now, but so do pupils and teachers from five local schools, as well, sometimes as young children from a nearby nursery.

We now also have a brass consort from Redmaids' High School, augmented by pupils from QEH who accompany the hymn National Anthem and play music during the laying of wreaths.

Although a fairly simple service lasting approximately 45 minutes, there is much organisation behind the scenes to ensure all goes smoothly and, hopefully, according to plan.

We have portable barriers to ensure a good space is reserved for younger pupils to have a clear view of proceedings without them being obscured by adults; we have a sound system so everyone can hear what's going on (which requires permission for use of an external power supply); Order of Service sheets which uniformed cadets from Clifton College hand out (it is a priority that every pupil has a copy to take home with them) and a bugler or trumpeter to play the Last Post. Clergy have to be invited and briefed and decisions made on who should read the Kohima Epitaph and the Exhortation. Schools need to be given details of when to arrive and, on arrival, wreath layers need to be briefed.

And, of course, there is the clearing up at the end to ensure the site is left clean of any debris and discarded poppy boxes!

One thing, sadly. we can't control, is the weather, though we do have emergency plans to keep clergy and brass players – and their instruments – dry.

So, please come and join us and be moved by the young pupils of St John's and SS Peter & Paul Schools when they sing *Wherever You Are*, written for the Military Wives Choir to sing at the Royal British Legion's Festival of Remembrance in 2011 and which rarely leaves a dry adult eye.

This year's Annual Act of Remembrance takes place on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> November 2024; gather at the St. John's Memorial Whiteladies Road by 10.45am.




ASC Walks. Everyone, and their dog, welcome Saturday November 9th


