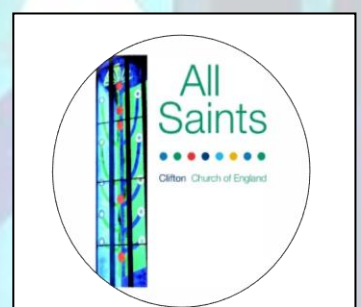

## The Atrium Development

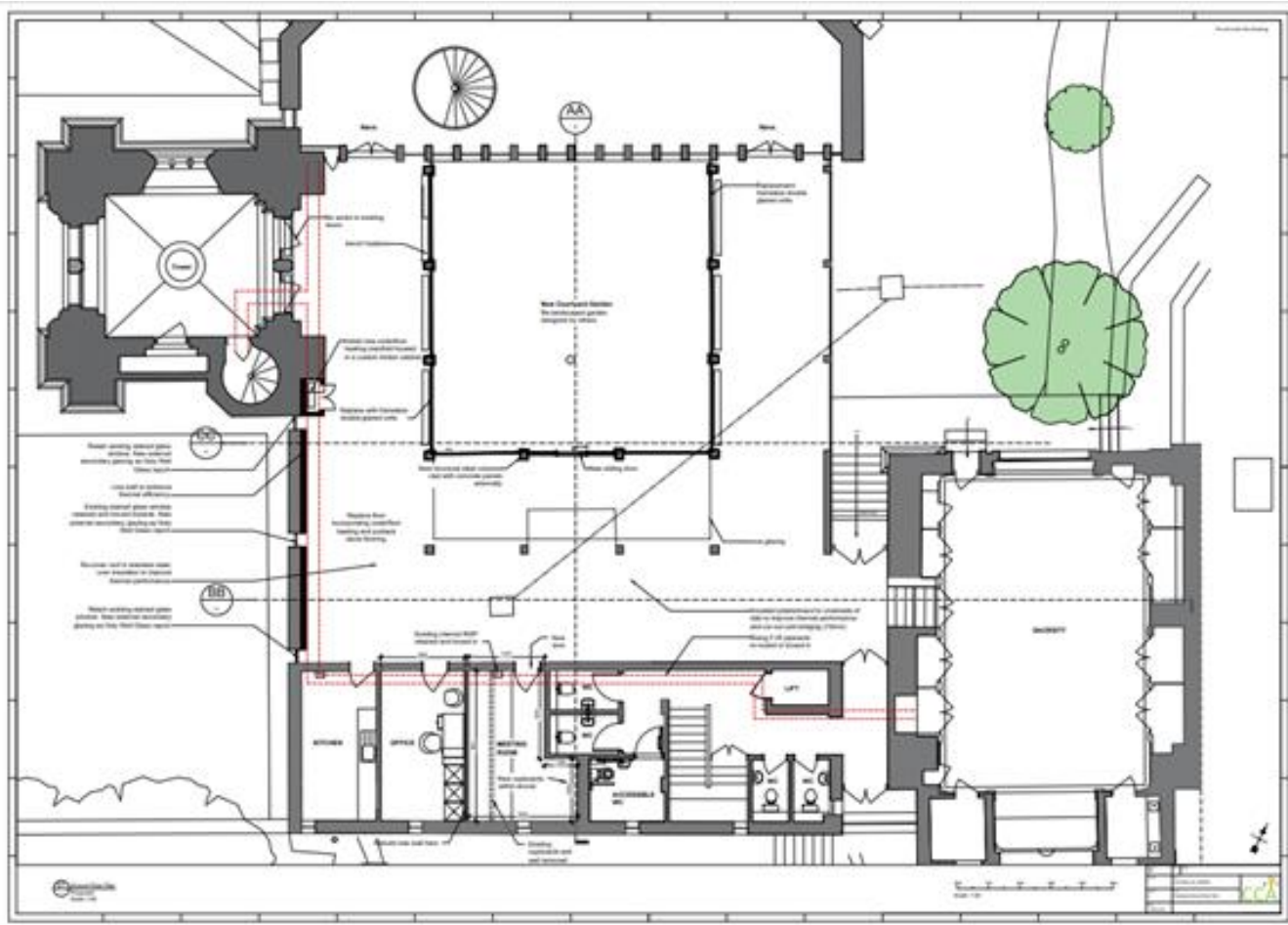
### Achieving Net Zero, Providing Accessible Toilets, Improving Heating and Increasing Community Relevance

Following the grant of planning permission we are proceeding with our application for a faculty (the permission from the diocese that is necessary for church buildings). The dual jurisdiction arises because the planning authority is largely concerned with the effect of development on the surrounding environment; and the diocese is predominantly concerned with the impact on the interior.

The PCC and the Endowment Trustees have been considering the detail of the proposals. This has been a very worthwhile process of joint consideration and informed discussion. As a result, we have, jointly, made some adjustments - essentially to move the location of the new toilets (originally intended to be built over the steps leading to the garden) so that they are now near the existing . This has the advantage of having the facilities in one place and enables us to include two new standard toilets as well as one that is fully accessible. It will also mean some significant cost savings on the full project!

The re-ordering is shown on the plan below. A large-scale plan is currently displayed in the atrium.

We are grateful to the PCC members, the Endowment Trustees and all others for their considerable contribution to this final design. As this exciting project moves forward it will be really important to keep everyone informed and engaged. Thank you all for your contributions as we plan to take this significant step forward to ensure the future for ASC.

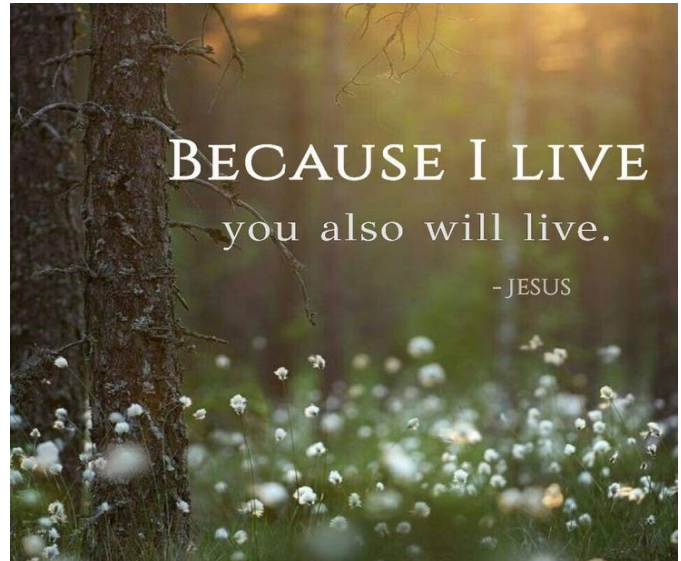

# ALL SAINTS PRAYERS

Mon 11	<b>Armistice Day</b> <b>Martin, Bishop of Tours 397</b> Pray for those who find their faith or values incompatible with the expectations of others. Especially we pray for conscientious objectors and pacifists. Remember those who gave their lives in the Great Wars, and those who continue to put their lives on the line from duty and in our defence.
Tue 12	Ours often feels a world of conflict. Pray for those who work to bring agreement and understanding. Those who work for peace and concord – be it in places of turmoil and physical danger, in societies without tolerance, or in homes broken apart by difference.
Wed 13	<b>Mass 10.00 am</b> <b>Charles Simeon, Priest, Evangelical Divine, 1836</b> Pray for orphans. Each year millions of children become orphans because of war, famine, displacement, disease, poverty and accident. Whist care of orphans was enshrined in Roman, Greek and Jewish law from very early in history the responsibility for care transferred to the Church in the early mediaeval period (in Europe). Pray for all those who have responsibility to care for orphans.
Thurs 14	<b>Samuel Seabury, first Bishop of N America 1796</b> Pray for the LGBT (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender) community may they find a place in society free of suffering due to intolerance and misunderstanding. Pray for our Church that we may find ways to live the Gospel and not be divided by fundamentalist attitudes .
Fri 15	<b>Mass 10.00 am</b> Pray for individuals and organizations who operate philanthropically. Through their love of humanity they seek to care, nourish, develop and enhance the lives of others. May we adopt these attitudes and behaviours ourselves.
Sat 16	<b>Margaret, Queen of Scotland, reformer 1093</b> Pray for those who work amongst people in need and in desperate circumstances, for the homeless and people who live on the periphery. In particular the work of the Sisters of the Church and the Julian Trust here in Bristol.
Sunday 17	<b>2nd before Advent</b>  Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son was revealed to destroy the works of the devil and to make us the children of God and heirs of eternal life: grant that we, having this hope, may purify ourselves even as he is pure; that when he shall appear in power and great glory we may be made like him in his eternal and glorious kingdom.  <b>Early Worship 9.00am                      Parish Mass 10.30am</b>
