Nicaea 2025 Living the Apostolic Faith Together Today

The year 2025 marks the 1700th anniversary of the world's first Ecumenical Council, the Council of Nicaea of 325, a key moment in the history of Christian faith and for the ecumenical journey today.

Here, at ASC, we will mark this Anniversary as an element of our Lent preparation. The Creed can be divided into five sections and, over five Sundays, we will reflect upon the significance of each of these sections. This is also supported by the USPG Lent Study Programme ('We Believe') which is available in the Atrium.

Affirming the Christian faith

The first Ecumenical Council in 325 was a gathering of Christian bishops in Nicaea, now İznik in present-day Türkiye, as the first attempt to reach consensus in the church through an assembly representing all of Christendom, and to affirm the Christian faith in the triune God.

In Nicaea, Christians who only recently had been persecuted in the Roman Empire were able to gather under the patronage of the Emperor to affirm their faith and witness to the society around them. Then, as now, the call to unity was heard within the context of a troubled, unequal, and divided world.

The anniversary offers an opportunity to celebrate and reflect on the affirmation of faith in the Nicene Creed, the mission of God's triune love and the implications this has for the common witness and service of the churches, and offers the opportunity to ask afresh with others what Nicaea means for churches and Christians today.



Lent 2025 at All Saints

This year there will be a number of Lenten activities and events on offer. These will include:

- Lectio Divina in Richard Chapel
 These will take place on Wednesdays in Lent at 3.00pm These are useful for those who don't wish to leave home in the evenings.
- * Sermon Sequence (Sunday sermon and Discussion) Five sermons on the Nicene Creed. The Nicene Creed divides into five sections: Creator God, Incarnation and the Messiah, Inspiration of the Holy Spirit, Mother Church and Unity and the Hope of Resurrection and Communion of Saints. Starting on the Sunday before Lent (before Ash Wednesday) the Sunday sermon will follow these themes with an opportunity to talk with the 'preacher' after the Parish Mass.
- Individual Prayer and Reflection through the USPG Study Guides and Reflections on the **Nicene Creed.** 2025 marks a significant year in the Anglican Communion and for other global Christian traditions as we mark the 1700th anniversary of the world's first Ecumenical Council. This study guide has been produced to encourage you, in the fellowship of other Christians to prayerfully reflect on the significance of the Council of Nicaea and its legacy in shaping the Christian faith. The Study Guides are available in the Atrium.
- Lent Quiet Day at the Cathedral (Saturday 15 March) —

 'Meditation on the Seven Last Words'. A day of reflection, combining Kenneth Wilson's meditative poetry, J.S. Bach's six soulful cello music, and Gillian Lever's abstract artwork. Kenneth will lead his Meditation on the Seven Last Words, with moments of silent reflection after each poem, creating a deeply contemplative space this Lent. Please drop into the Sacristy and speak to any member of the team after mass on Sunday and we can talk to you about it..


