Annual Parochial Church Meeting

Several things happen at the **Annual Parochial Church Meeting**, these include:

- Presentation of the up-to-date Electoral Roll (this year a new roll!)
- Presentation of the Annual Report, which includes the Annual Accounts
- Election of Deanery Synod Lay Members (potentially, we have one casual vacancy for one year)
- Election of lay members of the PCC for three years (we have four vacancies) and one casual vacancy for one year)
- Appointment of the independent auditor

And, of course, the appointment of two Churchwardens at the Parish meeting that precedes the APCM.

What does the PCC do?

There are a number of functions of the PCC, of which perhaps the most important, and certainly the most wide-ranging, is:

'co-operation with the incumbent in promoting, in the parish, the whole mission of the Church: pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.'

Functions also include:

- The consideration and discussion of matters concerning the Church of England or any other matters of religious or public interest, but not the declaration of the doctrine of the Church on any question
- Making known and putting into effect any provisions made by the diocesan synod or the deanery synod, but without prejudice to the powers of the council on any particular matter
- Giving advice to the diocesan synod and the deanery synod on any matter referred to the council
- Raising such matters as the council consider appropriate with the diocesan synod or deanery synod

During the autumn there will be a series of session exploring the place and significance the Blessed Virgin Mary in the life of the Church and in the prayer and discipline of individual Christians.


This will be led by Mthr Nicola.




