The Atrium Development

Where are we now?

Thank you for all who have been asking when the work will start (and, even better) be finished. There's good news!

We are now at the point where we have:

- Planning Permission (from Bristol City Council)
- ★ The Faculty from the Diocese to commence the work
- Completed both Statutory and Public Consultations (with no objections or questions)
- ★ Invited tenders from potential contractors for a 'Fixed Price Contract'

Remind me, why are we doing this?

We will be finishing work started in 1967 with the creation of a multi-purpose Atrium, and we will benefit in ensuring this is fit for the 21st century. These benefits include:

- Meeting our Carbon Net Zero requirements with the installation of a solar array and air-source heat pumps on the cloister roof.
- Reducing the 40% energy loss (heat) from Church into the Atrium through effective insulation double glazing and under-floor heating.
- * Providing additional toilets, including an ambulatory toilet to achieve our accessibility obligations.
- ➤ Delivering against recommendations in our quinquennial and fire risk assessment reports (legal obligations).
- * Providing a warm and welcoming environment for worshippers and visitors with an increased circulation area for festivals, weddings, funerals and other events.
- Developing existing relationships with the local and more distant community; to further encourage the use of the Church, Randall Room and other facilities to support future income and financial viability.

What happens next?

The next phase of the Atrium work will take us into the construction period. However, first we need to:


- Agree, with the Architect and others, which of the tendered fixed price contracts we accept
- Ensure we have the funds available between the PCC, any available small grants and a request to the Endowment Trust

When this is achieved we will, hopefully, commence work in March 2026 with a target of concluding in October or November 2026. An operations team will meet soon and will ensure the smooth functioning of All Saints over the construction period.

This is very exciting and will benefit the ministry and mission of All Saints within this community



Madonna of the Harpies - a postscript

A couple of weeks ago, I wrote an article about the reproduction of "Madonna of the Harpies" that hangs in the Lady Chapel. Roger Hopkins has kindly sent me a little more information.

"According to the text in the old AS guide book (published 50 years ago and written by the then vicar Fr John Norton)," writes Roger, "the picture then hung in the eastern bay of the St Richard Chapel (it was probably sited where the illuminated panel from St John's Church is now located).

Fr John says that the supporting Saints are St Francis and St John the Evangelist. Also that the painting was presented by old pupils of Mortimer House School in memory of its founder Katherine Rose Heath. Something in the back of my mind says that there was a connection with St Mary's Tyndalls Park, with which we were joined at the time."

Neither Roger nor I have been able to find more information, but it is good to know a little more about the picture's origins.



This winter All Saints will be running a 'warm coats for winter' coat rack in the porch beside the Food Point. The coat rack will be open throughout December, January and February.


If you have warm coats of any description – men's women's or children's please check what is on the coat rack and donate when you can.




