Atrium Project Update

Where are we now?

A great deal has been happening over the last few weeks. This is a very good news story!

As a reminder, we are now at the point where we have:

- ★ Planning Permission (from Bristol City Council)
- ★ The Faculty from the Diocese to commence the work
- ★ Completed both Statutory and Public Consultations (with no objections or questions)
- ★ Invited and received tenders from potential contractors for a 'Fixed Price Contract'

And, as of this week, the PCC has requested a grant to fund the work from the All Saints Endowment Trust. This has been approved and confirmed by the Trustees! This means with the allocation of the £400k from the PCC, the £1.3m grant provided by the Endowment Trust and a grant provided by the Benefact Trust, we are able to fully fund this project.

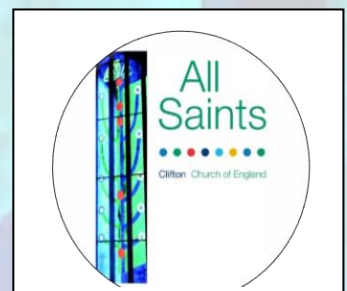
Why are we doing this?

We will be finishing work started in 1967 with the creation of a multi-purpose Atrium, and we will benefit in ensuring this is fit for the 21st century. These benefits include:

- ★ Meeting our Carbon Net Zero requirements with the installation of a solar array and air-source heat pumps on the Atrium Roof.
- ★ Reducing the 40% energy loss (heat) from Church into the Atrium through effective insulation, double glazing and under-floor heating.
- ★ Providing additional toilets, including an ambulatory toilet to achieve our accessibility obligations.
- ★ Delivering against recommendations in our Quinquennial and Fire Risk Assessment reports (these are legal obligations).
- ★ Providing a warm and welcoming environment for worshippers and visitors with an increased circulation area for festivals, weddings, funerals and other events.

- ★ Developing existing relationships with the local and more distant community; to further encourage the use of the Church, Randall Room and other facilities to support future income and financial viability.

What happens next?

The next phase of the Atrium work will take us into the construction period. However, first we **need to**:

- The Architect, Quantity Surveyor and others will recommend to the PCC which of the tendered fixed price contracts are most appropriate
- The PCC will discuss the recommendation, agree which tender to accept and enter into contract with the selected provider

When this is achieved, we will, hopefully, commence work in March 2026 with a target of concluding in October or November 2026. The PCC will form a Project Group as a subcommittee (reporting to the PCC and keeping the Endowment Trust informed) who will meet to ensure the smooth functioning of All Saints over the construction period.

The Incumbent, Churchwardens and PCC are indebted to and thank the Endowment Trustees for their continuing support of the life and work of All Saints.

We recognise that this is a very significant project and comes at considerable cost, however the importance of the project's benefits to the worshipping community, the mission, work and witness of All Saints, the life of the local and wider community are such that this will be a huge step forward.

Additionally, recognising that All Saints' Church was erected in 1967, it is noted that certain parts of the fabric have deteriorated and become outdated. This project will address much of this.

Continuing Support?

Over the last ten years the Endowment Trust has supported the work and mission of the church in many ways:

- ★ Provision of the ASC Forecourt (and standing area in front of the Richard Chapel)
- ★ Conservation of Richard Chapel exterior stonework
- ★ Refurbishment and restoration of the Walker Organ (the 'Sound of Clifton')
- ★ Modernisation of Church and Richard Chapel Lighting
- ★ Provision and installation of Director of Music plaques
- ★ Match funding the ASC Missional and Seasonal charity giving
- ★ Care and maintenance of Vicarage, gardens, trees and lawns

Giving is therefore first and foremost not a matter of practicality, but part of our everyday faith and discipleship – our journey of following Christ. We will form a Stewardship Team who will work with us to consider our giving of:

- Treasure
- Talents

to the benefit of the life and mission of All Saints.

There are many 'thankyous' that relate to Christmas, however, three are:

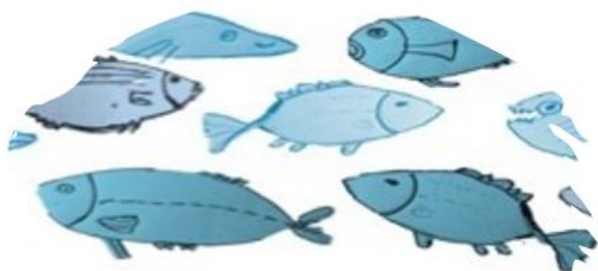
- ★ Thank you, for all those who made the liturgy, music and worship over Christmas meaningful and special.

Sessions are held on Sundays, starting at 12.30 and finishing at 1.30pm. Meeting in the Sacristy with lunch provided.

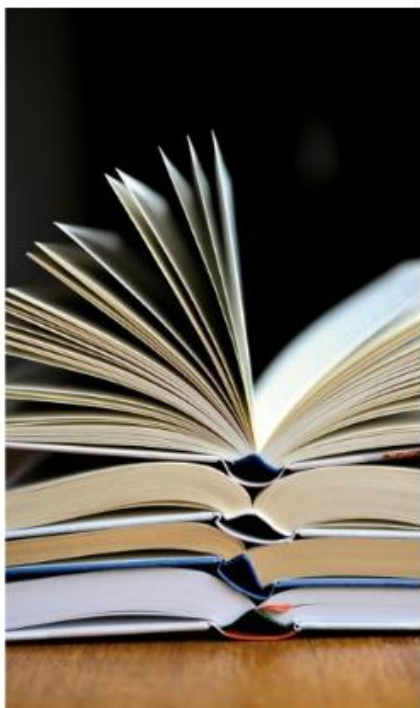
The next meeting is on Sunday 1st of February .

The Brownies meet in the Randall Room at 5.30 pm each Friday in term time .



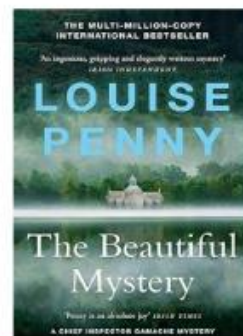
All Saints Book Group

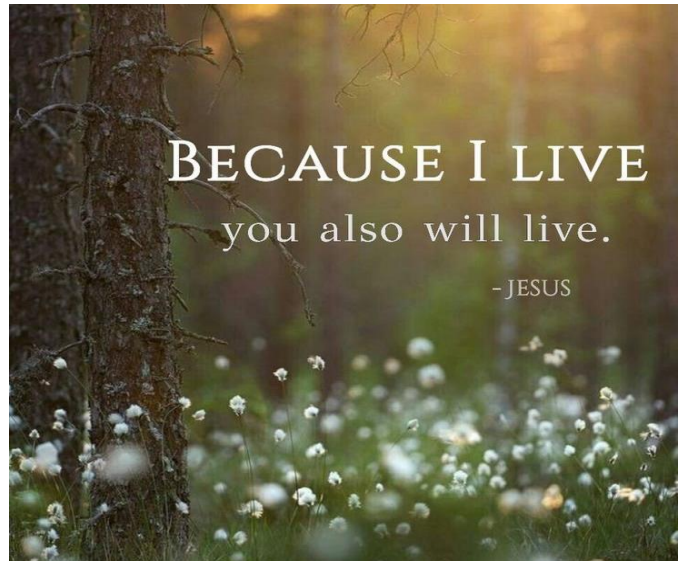
